⁹For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, ¹⁰so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, ¹¹being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, ¹²and giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light.

13For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. (Colossians 1 NIVUK)

One of the themes which has emerged during our time reflecting on the Book of Acts is "from where do you find your worth?". This is particularly relevant for me because of my own personal journey of the past year.

It has been almost a year since I was first signed off (where has the time gone!?). As I approach that "anniversary", I continue to reflect on that time, as well as the time since returning. Pleasingly, I am still discovering lessons that the LORD desired to teach me.

When I was first signed off, I struggled with a loss of worth. It felt I had my ministry removed from me; without my ministry, who was I? How could I identify myself, if not as "a minister"? What did this mean for my relationship with God, if I was not serving him as a minister in His Church?

These questions led me to identify one of my critical errors in thinking; one which undoubtedly contributed to my needing time off - I was drawing my worth from my ministry.

What did this mean? Well, when ministry was going "well" (however one defines this), I was well and felt fulfilled. When things went "badly" (again, however you define this... and let us be honest, we all would have our own measure of what counts as "well" and "bad!), my self-worth was damaged.

Now, it is not my intention to over-share or air my dirty laundry in this pastoral letter! So, I will not go into the detail of exactly how I personally was affected by damaged self-worth. In fact, I doubt I will have to: I am sure each of you will have your own stories of times your self-worth was damaged, and the affect it had on you. Needless to say, and I'm sure we can all agree on this: it is not pretty!

Herein lies the problem with seeking worth in worldly things. Nothing in this fallen world can last forever; everything fades and fails eventually. They will always let us down, and if we seek self-worth in such things, we will always come away damaged.

There is only one thing that can never let us down, from which we can draw our self-worth and never be damaged: Jesus.

This is, in essence, Paul's prayer in the passage from Colossians, quoted above. He is praying that the Church in Colossae are filled with the knowledge of God and strengthened by His power; and that their response to that infilling would be to live lives which seek His glory as a priority every single day. Why? So that they might discover and know real, lasting self-worth: that, through Jesus, we are brought into God's family as His beloved children.

My self-worth comes from the fact that I am assured of my status as God's child because it is granted to me by Christ; thus nothing can damage, undermine, or change it. Truly, this brings me joy, and great relief as a deep burden is lifted.

Paul prayed that the Church in Colossae would know this. I pray that you might know it too.

Garden Cafe

Over the summer we had the privilege of running the garden café for the second year. We were blessed in so many ways with the large number of visitors of all ages, many of whom have no church connection. One comment we received was "I have looked after people all my life, but in the last 8 weeks you have looked after me". We have made new friends and new contacts in the people who assisted with the music. People were very generous and we raised £934, which included a donation of £120 from the Brass Monkeys' concert. This will go into the Mission and Outreach fund to develop further outreach events such as Pop up Church in a local café every 6 weeks. A big thank you to everyone who came along to support the café and to all our volunteers and bakers over the 8 weeks who helped make this a great success! We look ahead and have a strong sense of the need to do something over the winter months. Once the team meet in a few weeks' time we will have a clearer idea of our plans.
