Letter from the Manse

³Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them round your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart.

⁴Then you will win favour and a good name in the sight of God and man.

⁵Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding;

⁶In all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

⁷Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil.

⁸This will bring health to your body and nourishment to your bones. (Proverbs 3 NIVUK)

Proverbs is a simultaneously fascinating, but tricky, book of the Bible. It is very much focussed on the idea of Wisdom; that is, the True Wisdom which is from God, and if we want to receive or live by that Wisdom, we would do well to listen to God's direction, discerning His will and His way.

Proverbs is made tricky by the fact that it is a collection of sayings. It is not uncommon for a chapter of Proverbs to contain several themes, with these themes seeming to have little connection with one another; beyond the recognition that this is all God's Wisdom and we do well to heed it. Looking for a common theme in Proverbs for, say, a sermon series, is therefore a challenge.

The three couplets above could easily be read and meditated upon in isolation. Each is like a deep well, with the potential to quench even the deepest spiritual thirst. In this reflection, however, I would take the three together; for there is a common thread which runs throughout, and is relevant for our current situation.

Beginning with verses 3 and 4: here we have, stated plainly, God's call to those who follow Him. We are to live in love and faithfulness: indeed, these are to take such deep root in our lives that we might bind them on our necks (feeling the continual weight of love and faithfulness and being reminded to live them out) or write them on our very hearts (taking the call of love and faithfulness so deeply into ourselves they become fundamental to who we are).

This is followed by instruction in what not to do - do not lean on your own understanding! Oh, how often we do this, and how often it leads to calamity: we breenge ahead, believing we know the right direction, the correct action, only to leave a trail of destruction in our wake, all the while discovering we are no further forward. No, we are to trust in the Lord, submit to Him, and let Him make our path straight. This requires a counter-intuitive slowing down; purposefully choosing to wait until God's voice and direction is discerned.

If we take heed of verses 3 to 6, then what is recorded in verses 7 and 8 will become true of us. We will accept we are not wise, we will instead fear the Lord, being obedient to Him, rejecting all that is opposed to Him (in this context, fear does not mean to be afraid. Rather, it means to recognise God's overwhelming position over us; to feel awe and wonder at His glory and majesty; to respect Him as the ruler of all Creation; to love Him as our Saviour and Heavenly Father). In doing this, we will be healthy and nourished.

This does not mean living care-free lives of good physical health. Though, it does mean we are less likely to be stressed, anxious or overwhelmed by our world: if we are leaning on God's Wisdom and Understanding, and trusting He is directing us along the path of life, then we have nothing to fear. We are walking the way He wishes for us, whatever that way may bring. Our call is simply to live faithfully following Him and His way, wherever that leads us.

Which is the real way we are healthy and nourished. If we are leaning on God in this way, allowing His direction, and living faithfully - then we must know Jesus Christ as our Saviour and Lord. We must know all the He has done for us, and all that we have been granted through Him: status as God's Children, the promise of the resurrection to eternal life. This brings us health and nourishment as we live in this hope in the present, awaiting the fulfilment in the future.

All this is my encouragement to you as we continue through dark and uncertain times; not least in the immediate future of our congregation. There is a path to walk, though it is indistinct. Let us, therefore, lean on God's understanding; trust that He is leading us down the right path; and commit to accepting whatever comes, knowing that no matter what, we will live faithfully, in response to the salvation we have received through Christ.

Christian Aid Week: 14-20 May 2023

Dear Clincarthill friends

We are arriving at May now which sees the annual Christian Aid week appeal. We have a long history in our church family of supporting the congregational envelope collection every year. This year I am asking on behalf of Christian Aid for you continued support of the envelope collection.

Please pray for the success across the UK of this year's collection against the challenges of the cost of living and the call from many other causes which desperately need our support.

Christian Aid say "We won't stop until everyone has the chance to live a full life, free from poverty. We are united in hope that, with your help, more people will be able to transform their lives".

This year's appeal from Christian Aid focuses on Malawi. Families in Malawi are paying the price of this global crisis. Food, fuel, fertiliser, and school fees have doubled in price in the last 12 months. And hard-working farmers are seeing their harvests fail as the climate crisis brings increasingly erratic weather. The impact of the recent Cyclone Freddy in Malawi has been devastating. Floods have washed away crops, over 500,000 people have been displaced and hundreds have lost their lives. Malawi experienced a year's worth of rain during the 4-week cyclone. The number of people affected by the Tropical Cyclone in Malawi continues to rise. Over 508,000 people are displaced, and hundreds have lost their lives. There's also an increased risk of malaria and cholera in the immediate aftermath.

Christian aid partners and team in Malawi have been responding to the immediate recovery needs of communities. This includes:

- Corn soya blend for porridge for breastfeeding mothers and children under 5 years
- Mosquito nets for families to provide protection against malaria
- Providing temporary toilets and bathrooms, water containers and water treatment to help prevent the risk of cholera
- Mobile clinics to help people process the emotional trauma of the cyclone

Christian Aid is at its most powerful when a disaster happens. Through us, they will be there long after the flood waters recede, helping families build back. Your gifts this May will continue to support vital work around the world.

Envelopes will be distributed around the church over the coming weeks, I can also collect any envelopes from those who wish to participate but can't make it to church, or you can donate online if that is more convenient. You can pop the envelope in the collection plates or ask an elder to take it for you or pass it directly to me. I will collect throughout the following weeks.... Until the end of May.
