#### Letter from the Manse

<sup>11</sup>When Solomon had finished the temple of the Lord and the royal palace, and had succeeded in carrying out all he had in mind to do in the temple of the Lord and in his own palace, <sup>12</sup>the Lord appeared to him at night and said:

'I have heard your prayer and have chosen this place for myself as a temple for sacrifices.

<sup>13</sup>'When I shut up the heavens so that there is no rain, or command locusts to devour the land or send a plague among my people, <sup>14</sup>if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land. <sup>15</sup>Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to the prayers offered in this place. <sup>16</sup>I have chosen and consecrated this temple so that my Name may be there for ever. My eyes and my heart will always be there. (1<sup>st</sup> Chronicles 7 NIVUK)

<sup>19</sup>Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days.'

<sup>20</sup>They replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?' <sup>21</sup>But the temple he had spoken of was his body. <sup>22</sup>After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the Scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken. (John 2 NIVUK)

<sup>19</sup>Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; <sup>20</sup>you were bought at a price. Therefore honour God with your bodies. (1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 6 NIVUK)

An interesting way of reflecting on a Biblical theme is trace it through Scripture. The example above focusses on the idea of "temple": going from the Old Testament, into the Gospels, and Epistles.

In Solomon's day, God resided in a physical location. God then resided in Jesus, in the sense that Jesus is God Incarnate; i.e. God in human form. Finally, thanks to Jesus death and resurrection, as well as the coming of the Holy Spirit, we each have God's presence within us.

All this charts something of God's journey to us through salvation's plan: going from being separated from us, coming to us in Christ, to living in us thanks to Christ's death and resurrection. We now have the delight of God's presence, not because of anything we did to earn it, but because of everything God did on our behalf, through Christ

The implication of all this is raised by Paul in his section: given all Christ has done, we are not our own. We were bought at the price of Christ, therefore we should honour God with our bodies. The context of  $1^{st}$  Corinthians 6 is a discussion about avoiding sexual immorality; however, I think we can broaden Paul's scope here.

If we truly are indwelt by God's Spirit, making us Temples of His Presence, then we ought to reflect on how our living reflects that. What does it mean for me to live projecting the presence of God into the world? How do I honour him with what I do, say and think? How do I show Christ to stranger, neighbour, colleague and friend?

These questions are crucial: not least because it is through living for God in Christ's name that we can be used by His Spirit to make a difference in our world. I remain convinced that what the Church needs is not another programme or project; it needs the people of God to rediscover what it means to simply live for Christ, as His Temple here on earth.
